Secondary Music Fund

We have funding available for schools that want to turn a corner with music for their secondary age pupils. The money can be spent on skills development, resources, participatory work, outside expertise or anything else that will genuinely make a big and lasting difference. Special Schools in Wiltshire can apply for up to £1,000 per school for activity to be delivered during the 2018-19 academic year. The deadline for applications is Monday 11 June at 12 noon.

First Access

First Access is about providing whole classes or class groups with a formative opportunity to experience and enjoy music making. This should generally be offered by the end of Key Stage 2 – it’s also referred to as Wider Opportunities or Whole Class Ensemble Teaching (WCET). First Access can be delivered by non-specialist classroom teachers or by a specialist music tutor (see details of our Directory below).

Wiltshire Music Connect offers the following support for schools that want to deliver First Access:

- **iPads for First Access** – support in using iPads effectively + access to sets of iPads all set up for music making, FREE LOAN
- **Set of five “Skoogs”** (accessible accessory for iPads with adjustable sensitivity – squeeze, tap, press to make music) FREE LOAN
- **First Access in a Box** – a scheme that supports members of school staff to deliver First Access using Ocarinas, subsidised price of £100
- **e-Learning Subsidy** – we can cover 40% of the cost of purchasing e-learning platforms such as Charanga or Sound Trap that can be used to deliver First Access
- **Subsidy for First Access Tuition** – We can subsidise the cost of First Access tuition where it is delivered by one of our Associate tutors and/or a designated member of school staff
- **Access to First Access Instrument Sets** – subsidised instrument hire for your school

Instrumental and Vocal Tuition Subsidy

We want to make sure that learners facing more challenging circumstances also have sustained opportunities to learn about and experience music. We offer the following support for school-based tuition:

- 100% for Looked after by Wiltshire Council children – 1 instrument initially
- 70% reduction for SEN/disabilities

Where it simply isn't possible for a pupil to get the tuition they need in school, we can support eligible pupils' tuition outside of school.

Instrument Hire Scheme

We want to make instruments accessible to children and young people in a way that supports their participation and progression and so we offer a subsidised instrument hire scheme that makes it affordable for all. Instruments can be hired to pupils and schools who are receiving tuition from an Associate Provider within a school setting.

Music Cluster Meetings and Music Cluster Funding

Music Clusters are mini Hubs that bring together musical communities at a localised level. Music Cluster meetings are attended by a broad range of people including school teachers, tutors, venues, organisations and societies. We encourage all Wiltshire schools to send representatives to Music Cluster meetings so that they can network with colleagues, share good practice, and access our Music Cluster Funding. We also produce an annual report on music in each cluster – the reports are all available to download from our website.

School Visits

We offer all schools in Wiltshire a FREE OF CHARGE visit from one of our Music Cluster Coordinators. This provides an opportunity to discuss the music provision in your school with a music specialist and identify ways of improving the offer for your pupils and celebrating your musical achievements. After the visit you will receive an individual School Music Report, written by our Cluster Coordinator, that you can present to Governors, use in performance management meetings, and if needed, show to Ofsted.
